It's All About the Bike! Kinetic Kids learn to ride a bike in one week!

Lose the Training Wheels is a national bike program that provides adaptive bikes to help kids learn to ride. Kinetic Kids is host to this great camp!

In August 2007, Kinetic Kids hosted its first bike camp to teach kids with special needs to ride a bike. Since that time, over 100 kids have fulfilled their dream

of riding a two wheeled bike! The basis of the Lose the Training Wheels program is using adapted bikes with custom designed rollers in place of the back tire. This teaches children to balance, pedal, steer, and ultimately ride a bike. Success rates for children participating in the camp is 80-100%. Ideal candidates are at least 8 years of age and have some experience pedaling a bike of some sort. Furthermore, it is ideal to expect family members to be ready to carry over with bike riding once the camp is over. The camp is appropriate for children with both physical and cognitive limitations, however, participants need to be able to walk by themselves (no a/d) as their primary mobility and have the personal desire to ride a bike.

Our February 2009 bike camp enrolled 16 eager participants who enjoyed their training with Kinetic Kids at St. George Maronite Church. Thank you to Fernando Fernandez and the entire staff at St. George Maronite who DONATED their fabulous gym facility to us for that week.

Thanks to our past volunteers from the community (Valero, National Charity League, Rackspace, UTHSC PT program, UTSA, UT medical students and residents, and many more) who tirelessly walked, jogged, and motivated the kids throughout the week.

Diana Neal, 2nd year veteran to the Endeavor Games says: "It's a great place to meet new friends my age and they encourage me to do my best!




