

Record Breakers:

Some Kinetic Kids athletes made history this year. Samuel DeRousse, broke the national record in the discus event. Samuel is 10 years old with cerebral palsy and competed in track and field events earning him 7 gold medals. Daniel Velasquez, who is 15 years old with cerebral palsy, brought home 8 gold medals, 1 bronze medal and qualified to compete at the National Junior Disability Championship being held in Saginaw, Michigan in July.

We asked Daniel to share a little of his story:

"National Junior Disabled Competition, NJDC, aka Nationals is an amazing 10 day event. While I have qualified every year since I started competing, this is my second year to compete there. Being able to compete in disabled sports with other teenagers that look and walk/run just like me, who have the same passion I do, is really what makes all the hard work worthwhile.

I usually compete at the Endeavor Games in Edmond OK in June to qualify for Nationals in July. While the Endeavor Games are a lot of fun, Nationals is not only fun, but a very serious competition. Nationals is also where a lot of the Paralympics coaches go to watch, teach clinics and recruit future USA Team members.

At Nationals this year, my goal was to have personal best in all my events. I competed in nine events, had personal best in 4 events, came in first in all nine events and set a National record for the Long Jump. Just for the record I hate the Long Jump, but decided to show up for a couple of jumps, so I wouldn't be disqualified. The first two jumps felt really good and next thing you know I broke the record. What a shock! This was my first event of the competition and it just 'Jump' started me and set the standard for the rest of the week.

Competition, medals, wins, all of these things are good, but one of best things about Nationals is the level of competition and the friendships that are made through competition. I have made many friends in the last two years and I fully expect these friendships to continue for a long time."
