SAFELY-DISTANCED & VIRTUAL PROGRAMS PROVIDE OUTLET

Kullen Flores-Medrano is thrilled to be back in the pool and he's not letting his inability to wear goggles interfere with his love for the water! The suction created by the goggles creates a sensory issue for Kullen, but he still needs to wear a visual aid to see clearly. At Kinetic Kids, that isn't a problem! Kullen splashes every chance he gets with his friends at Kinetic Kids.

Kullen's journey with Kinetic Kids began at age four after his mom, Stephanie, realized he was having a hard time fitting in at a local community program. "Kullen's autism gives him some different quirks and mannerisms. He couldn't tell at the time, but as parents, we could tell when the other kids weren't interacting with him," explained Stephanie. "We noticed when he wasn't given an opportunity to participate. Instead of building up my child, they focused on others who knew the



sport or didn't need extra help." When Stephanie hears stories like Kullen's she now tells other parents, "Don't be like me and wait so long."

Now ten years old, social interaction is very important to Kullen. While Kullen was staying active as a frequent visitor during our Stay Strong virtual programming Zoom calls, Stephanie knew Kullen still needed the personal connections and friendships. So when sociallydistanced, in-person programs launched in May, she signed him up for his favorite—golf!

Kullen's biggest concern about

returning was simple, "I wonder who my buddy is going to be?!" Though he loves partnering with his very own volunteer in the Allstars division, Kinetic Kids is currently asking families to provide a "buddy" in an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Kullen wasn't thrilled to learn his mom would be his buddy, but Stephanie says the fact that he is missing meeting a new person is exactly the reason why they love Kinetic Kids, "It goes way beyond the sports. It's a community. It gives us the opportunity to come together like a little family where we build each other up."
