Every child wants to be the best they can be. Belonging to a team, making friends, and having the chance to be "in the game" builds confidence and inspires joy in athletes and their families.

As Kinetic Kids has grown, so have our goals. Our first baseball team in 2001 gave just one group of children with special needs the opportunity to step up to the plate. But then they wanted to score goals. Run faster. Cheer louder. Swim longer. So as our Kinetic Kids' dreams grew, so did the need for competitive programming! In addition to our recreational programs, we now offer two competitive divisions that compete in a variety of sports across our city, state and country.

recreational RECAP

We offered 171 recreation programs in 2019, which is a 4% increase over 2018 and included two new sports. Most of the increase occurred in south San Antonio and New Braunfels.

SOUTH SAN ANTONIO EXPANSION

New partnerships with Palo Alto College and Little Cowboys soccer fields allowed us to offer three additional programs in 2019 which bumped participation in south side programming by 52 percent with Kinetic Kids enjoying dance, soccer, basketball and baseball. We also served 800 students with special needs at our second annual Get Active Day with partners: Believe It Foundation, Harlandale ISD and Edgewood ISD.

NEW BRAUNFELS EXPANSION

We were thrilled to add Das Rec, Extreme
Gymnastics, Dance by Design and Cemex Nature
Center as new facility partners in 2019. These
partnerships meant we were able to offer multiple
programs during both the fall and summer
seasons including basketball, swim, dance, CrossFit
and a one-day outdoor explorer event.

We are so proud of the additional opportunities we are providing for children with special needs and plan to continue expanding in 2020.





TWO NEW PROGRAMS







Featured as our "Paralympic pipeline," SA Xtreme has made strides in 2019! This competitive division is designed for athletes who only have physical disabilities. We offer track & field, swimming, wheelchair basketball, archery, tennis, boccia and goalball.

We are proud to have the very first adaptive youth archery team! Our team of 10 athletes competes both in and out of San Antonio.

In our second year at Junior
Nationals, we doubled the
number of Kinetic Kids athletes
who qualified and attended from
four to nine. Some athletes set
world records in track & field
events, and all nine set new
personal records in at least
one event.

Our wheelchair basketball team was on fire at the Larry Turner Classic. EVERY athlete scored a basket during the competition!

SAN ANTONIO ADAPTIVE YOUTH SPORTS

Appropriate for athletes with intellectual and/or physical disabilities, our Premier division includes gymnastics, cheerleading, dance, CrossFit, swimming, dive, basketball, and soccer. Though our gymnastic team has previously competed in Special Olympics, in 2019 we debuted basketball and soccer at the games with both advancing to state competition. Our basketball team also sealed several victories in Dallas.



Dancing her way through it all!

Sammi Haney has osteogenesis imperfecta, or brittle bone disease, a lifelong condition resulting in bones that break easily. Sammi's case is so severe that she was born with 19 fractures. Now nine years old, Sammi has endured over 100 fractures and too many surgeries to count, but none of that stops her!

Sammi's first Kinetic Kids program was dance, and she now competes with SA Premier dance team!

According to her mom, Priscilla, dance is Sammi's favorite activity because it gives her independence and the opportunity to socialize: "by the second class, she went in on her own, took off her shoes by herself, and I got to sit in the waiting room with the other parents while she danced with new friends."

To a mother, whose doctors could not even guarantee her daughter would make it through birth, these achievements are reason to be thankful. "She feels like she is part of a team. In her last performance I could see how excited and proud she was that they worked all season," Priscilla described through tears. "She felt like a winner. She felt like she won. And I can't wait for her to do it again."

Dancing is just one of Sammi's passions. She is also an actress and entrepreneur! She performs as Esperanza on the Netflix Original series *Raising Dion* and she serves as CEO of Disability Shirts, a t-shirt company her dad created to spread awareness and acceptance of the special needs community.



Kinetic Kids volunteers are the heart of our organization and play a pivotal role in allowing us to help children with special needs experience the joys of childhood in new and exciting sports and activities.

At first glance, you might not think the Gdovin brothers have much in common. Joey describes Michael as the clean-cut, super-organized brother who is pursuing a master's degree while working as an emergency department technician at University Hospital. Joey describes himself as a big hippie with dreadlocks, full-tattoo sleeves and a love of all things tie-dye who is pursuing a counseling degree while working at San Antonio Recovery Center.

It was Michael who stumbled upon the Kinetic Kids website. His love for sports connected with our mission. "I know sports are great for kids, especially for kids with special needs to help them be active, release energy, and stay involved," said Michael. After two seasons of volunteering he invited Joey to join him since they love spending time together giving back to their community. "We both have very long days that start at 6 a.m. I can't tell you how many times I'm getting out of school and I'm exhausted, but as soon as I work with the kids, my attitude changes. And I know this is where I'm supposed to be," said Joey.

STAFF SPOTLIGHT Sabrina Ponce

The special needs community has a special place in the heart of Sabrina Ponce. Her older brother, Saul, had spina bifida. His condition confined him to a wheelchair, but Sabrina does not remember him complaining about his disability or his wheelchair, "To him that was just an accessory, and he didn't let anything keep him from radiating love and joy." So, when she needed a 400-hour internship to complete her undergraduate degree, Sabrina knew Kinetic Kids was the best fit for her, even though it meant moving from Corpus Christi to San Antonio.

The internship was a great experience, until it ended. Sabrina simply didn't want to leave Kinetic Kids: "Once you start, you can't continue without them. These kids grab your heart." So, she transferred schools and volunteered while completing her occupational therapy degree.

Nearly 13 years after her brother's passing,
Sabrina remains committed to the special
needs community and to Kinetic Kids where
she now serves as a program director. "This
is somewhere the kids can be independent
and successful in sports they're interested in,"
said Sabrina. "My favorite part is the kids, but
I love looking back at the parents because
their faces say it all, too. Some are teary eyed,
others are smiling with such joy in their face
because they didn't think it was possible. It's a
sweet reminder what Kinetic Kids is about."

Amy, a former Mission CrossFit coach, has a daughter with special needs and loves the Kinetic Kids mission.
