recreational RECAP

Kinetic Kids returned to our pre-pandemic stride in 2022 by **serving 3,672 children with special needs** through 100% in-person programs. Our safe environment empowers our Kinetic Kids to build strength, confidence, skills and friendships. Offering 32 unique sports, fine arts and educational opportunities in 257 different programs means there is something for everyone!

Instead of building and maintaining a central location for programs, we partner with local businesses who often donate their existing facilities,

reducing our expenses. We hosted programs in 36 different facilities in San Antonio, New Braunfels, Castroville and Fort Worth, which means even more kids with special needs have access to our stages, fields, gyms and studios!

All year long, spirit tunnels buzzed with energy at soccer, tennis, skateboarding, gymnastics, pickleball and golf! Participants shouted with joy after breaking boards in martial arts, diving for rings in swimming, and hitting new personal records at CrossFit! Cameras flashed and families cheered at dance and musical theatre performances. Families celebrated during post-season pizza parties as the not-so-secret magic of Kinetic Kids sparkled around them all.



THREE BRAND-NEW PROGRAMS!

We expanded our options for our participants with the addition of volleyball, disc sports and robotics! Plus, our drumming, pickleball and flag football one-day clinics were upgraded to multi-week programs! No surprise in Texas, but football was a fan fave! We put the cleats into action as Kinetic Kids learned drills and improved their skills. On a sunny, Saturday afternoon, players rushed the field for their final game. Black under-eye paint reduced the glare and increased focus. Flags were pulled, yards were rushed and the touchdown cheers reminded us why we do what we do.

We are leading the way in high-level adaptive sports! Our SA Xtreme division serves kids with physical disabilities who compete in six different sports.

Our adaptive archery team boasts the **most national record holders and classified athletes in the United States!** Thanks to Leading Edge Archery and Coach Roger Koss who provide facilities, equipment and expertise!

SA Xtreme AgilityFit has **doubled in size in its second season.** Our partners at The Tribe opened the doors to their

CrossFit gym, giving our athletes access to functional fitness equipment that helps increase strength and agility for improved performance in city, regional and state performances.

SA Xtreme Swimming, Tennis, Wheelchair Basketball, and Track & Field continue to set high standards for themselves and their teammates. Our athletes dedicate ample time to their training and it is reflected in the national records they set and the personal records they beat.

We love how our athletes

exceed their own expectations, but we love the community they have built even more. One of our newest SA Xtreme athletes, Kirsten Brunson, sums it up nicely, "Being with my teammates makes me feel like I'm normal. **I'm the kid who runs really fast, not just the kid who doesn't have a leg.**" Her mom, Sherri Brunson, says the competitive opportunity at Kinetic Kids changed her viewpoint, too: "It has helped me see what an amazing athlete Kirsten truly is. With the awesome coaches who know how far they can safely push her, she is doing things I never would have dreamed for her. The impact Kinetic Kids has made in our lives is truly a godsend."



The SA Premier division of Kinetic Kids is growing so much that we welcomed 10 new sport-specific coaches in 2022. Now, we can serve more athletes who have intellectual and/or developmental disabilities with safe and successful programming!

SA Premier Cheer took a positive turn as we began a new partnership with the nationally-ranked Stars Vipers. Our new coaches are full of energy, ideas, and plans for growth! In their first competition, they placed third in the Elite Division at the National Cheer Association All-Star National Championships!

We restructured SA Premier Gymnastics to provide development opportunities for athletes to learn the basics of gymnastics with the goal of joining competitions and **the program tripled in numbers!** We look forward to even more growth in 2023.

SA Premier Soccer and SA Premier Basketball **both won first place at the 2022 Special Olympics State competition!** We love watching these programs gain momentum each year.

Baseball became our **newest SA Premier sport** as we partnered with Northside Suburban Little League to form our first team with 11 players.



LIGHTING THE PATH TO LEADERSHIP

We launched a new philanthropic leadership program in 2022—Kinetic Kids Ambassadors. Our inaugural class of 27 Ambassadors included current and past Kinetic Kids, siblings, parents, grandparents and supporters. They honed their skills in public speaking, fundraising and leadership to help increase their confidence as they shared their stories to help further our mission. From grassroots fundraisers, including lemonade stands and power washing, to partnering with corporate partners, their efforts were integral in helping achieve our organizational goal of raising \$100,000 in the month of July! We are grateful for the many ways they inspired others and promoted disability awareness as they championed our cause at local fundraising events and grant receptions. We are so proud of this team of future leaders who have a passion for Kinetic Kids' mission!



Resource Fair Returns

After a two-year hiatus, 595 attendees helped us welcome the return of EXPO, our free equipment, resource and vendor fair. Participants, their families, caregivers and health care providers explored resources for those living with disabilities. The sold-out event featured 63 vendors from the US & Canada offering home safety modifications, adapted equipment, mobility devices, orthotics, prosthetics, special needs camps, therasuits, therapy clinics, and so much more! Kids enjoyed face painting, arts and crafts, trying out adapted equipment and dancing with our Kinetic Kids performers. OUR MISSION: INCLUSION

We work diligently to enrich the lives of children with special needs with sports and fine arts offered in a safe, understanding and inclusive environment. Through our **Discovering Disabilities Day** events, we seek to improve their quality of life outside of our adapted environment by increasing awareness and inclusion in their community.

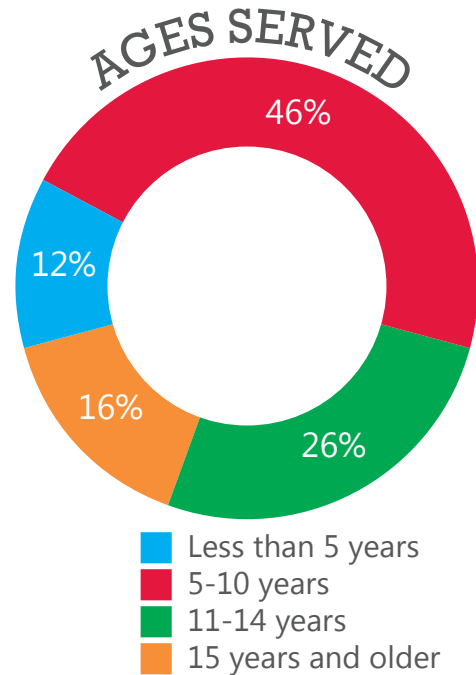
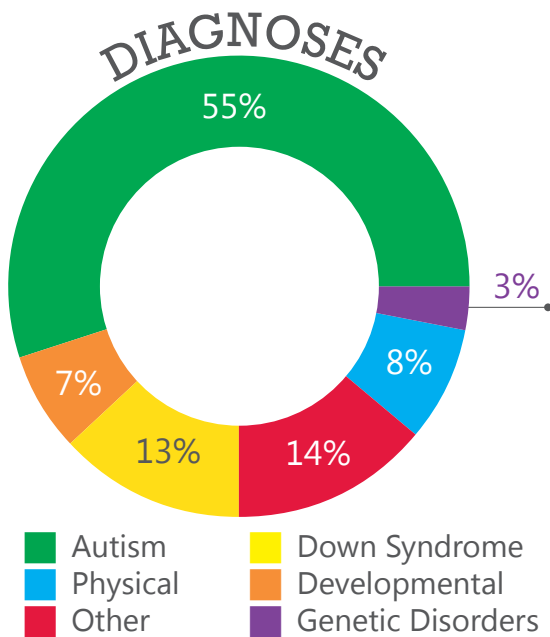
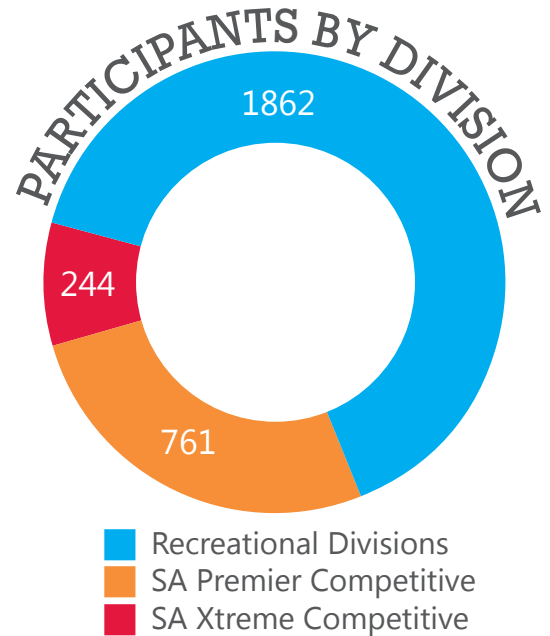
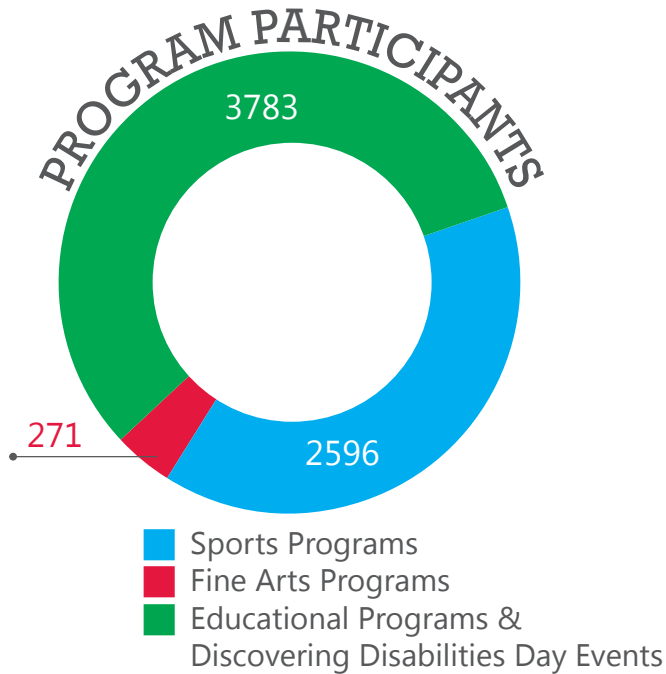
Field experts helped us design eight hands-on activities designed for elementary students to explore special needs and disabilities in an atmosphere where it is safe to ask probing questions. Educating children during their formative years is critical to developing understanding, and our dynamic training makes a difference. Children don dark glasses that limit their vision and learn to maneuver using a white cane. Certified American Sign Language interpreters teach basic sign language. We discuss the importance of helmets in preventing head injuries. They learn quickly that navigating a wheelchair is challenging. And sometimes they get frustrated trying to complete common tasks with limited hand function. But, that is the point.

In five Discovering Disability Day events at local schools in 2022, we delivered awareness training to 2,900 students who are now thinking of ways they CAN include others with special needs!

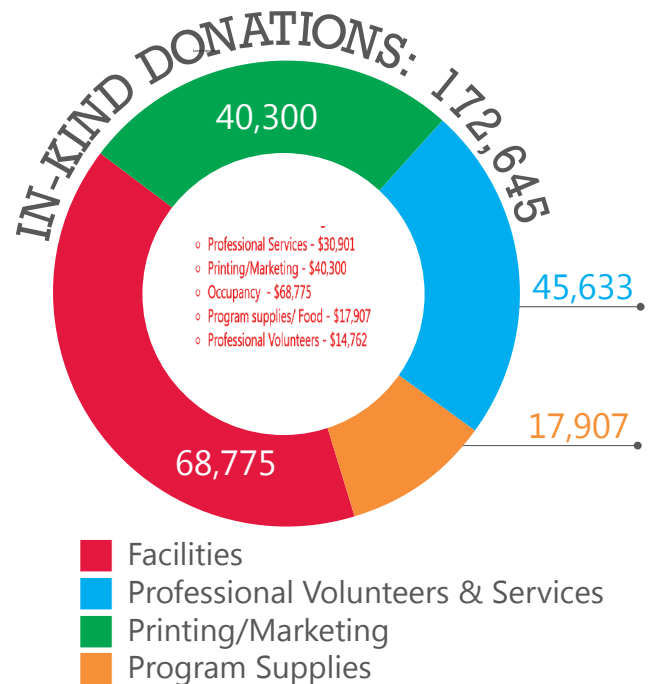
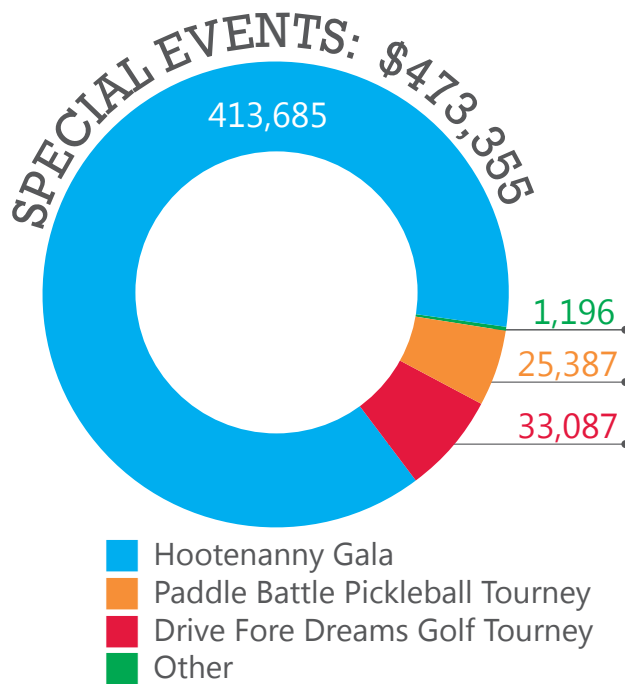
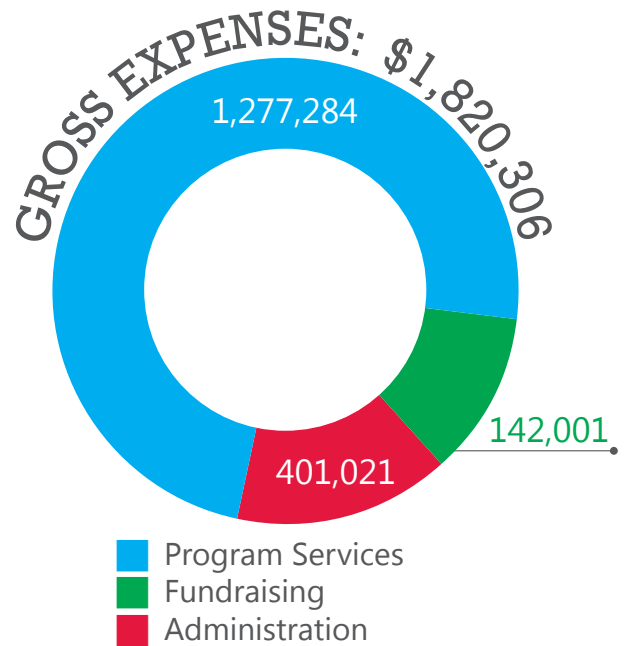
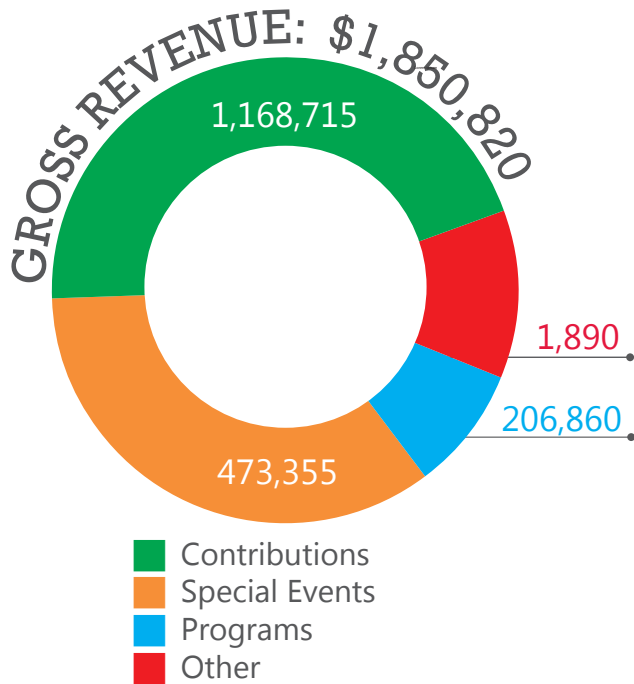

Kinetic Kids mothers Wendy Abeel and Jessica Swadick have an unlikely story of friendship that began in the unlikelyst of places. They met while navigating their way through the San Antonio foster care system.

Wendy began fostering two sisters, Sabrina and Anne Marie, when they were just 10 weeks and five months old. It did not take long for the Abeels to fall in love with the precocious pair and finalized their adoption two years later. The day before they were due in court to sign the final papers, Wendy received a call asking if she would like to also adopt the girls' youngest sister, Ashley, who was just three weeks old at the time.

Caught completely off guard, Wendy asked for additional time to make a decision. That is when Jessica and her husband, Jason, agreed to temporarily foster Ashley for about six months while the Abeels grappled with whether they could accept responsibility for another child in their family.

Of course, families who foster understand the importance of keeping siblings together and know how much it can help with the transitions so many children in foster care face. So, both sets of parents wanted the sisters to know each other and grow up together. But, just as the Abeels had fallen in love with their daughters, the Swadicks fell in love with Ashley and adopted her at 18 months old.

It is truly a fairy tale ending to an unconventional sisterhood. Wendy and Jessica are focused on providing unity for the sisters as they all grow up together in San Antonio. The girls know they are sisters, and the Abeel and Swadick families have combined into one, big, extended family. The girls beg for play dates. They celebrate holidays and birthdays together. And they love to carpool to their Kinetic Kids programs!

Yes, all three girls are Kinetic Kids! They all have similar intellectual disabilities and personalities, so Wendy and Jessica are able to share experiences and parenting techniques that work best for the girls, including Kinetic Kids.

In addition to building their strength, skills and confidence, Kinetic Kids is another place the girls can build stronger bonds as they create memories together. To date, they have tumbled through gymnastics, jumped into swimming, twirled through dance classes, and now compete together on even bigger stages as members of our SA Premier division dance team.

"Kinetic Kids has brought them closer together because they feed off each other. They feel like themselves and have such a strong bond as sisters and they flourish when they can do things together. Dance every Saturday gives them an outlet," says Wendy.

"Kinetic Kids provides a place for them to fit in. And having a no-judgment zone is the best! We love how it allows our families to just all fit in because other parents understand what life is like with special needs. At other programs, I feel like I always have to apologize, but the community that the Kinetic Kids family provides is unique and supportive. It's just such a blessing."





COLLABOROBORATION

We are always seeking ways to provide new possibilities. In 2022, we added our most unique program yet—Robotics!

Our collaboration with Lutheran High School of San Antonio's robotics team, the Mechanical Mustangs, is small but mighty! We are fortunate to have Lutheran High School's STEAM Instructor, Andrew Schuetze, and his wife, Gloria, who donate and dedicate their time and experience to lead our team as they learn to build and code robots as part of the FIRST in Texas FIRST Access program. A group of LHSSA's robotics team members also volunteer after school to mentor the Kinetic Kids team as they diagnose and solve problems, stay on schedule, and get ready for the next meet. And, the indispensable support provided by 3M Foundation brings the whole team together!

And yet, collaboration in this sport goes even deeper. At robotics competitions, opposing teams will help each other to ensure they are facing the very best. We love how this unique and challenging sport aligns with our mission—giving a helping hand is the expectation.



SETTING A GOAL: Making the match

Early in 2022, The Wade Richmond Foundation selected Kinetic Kids to participate in a unique and generous fundraising challenge: If Kinetic Kids could raise \$100,000 in the month of July, the foundation would match it with a \$100,000 donation of their own.

Like the kids we serve, who face and conquer obstacles everyday, we accepted the challenge!

Everyone got involved as we stretched for the most ambitious monthly goal we had ever set!
