recreational RECAP

In 2023, Kinetic Kids achieved remarkable strides by catering to a record-breaking 4,275 children with special needs. Our secure and nurturing environment continued to empower Kinetic Kids, fostering the development of courage, confidence, fitness and community. With a diverse array of 31 sports, fine arts and educational opportunities spanning 337 distinct programs, we truly have something for everyone!

Rather than investing in a central location for programs, we continue to forge partnerships with local businesses and other nonprofits, leveraging their

donated facilities when we can, thereby minimizing our expenses. We hosted programs at 47 different facilities in San Antonio and surrounding areas, ensuring that even more children with special needs could access top-notch programs on the same fields and stages where their typically-developing peers play.

On any given evening, the atmosphere buzzed with excitement as trophies and medals were triumphantly raised in baseball, flag football, and martial arts. Cheers of joy echoed as participants showcased their skills on skateboards, demonstrated swimming prowess, and executed flawless landings in gymnastics. Families gleamed with pride during our dance and musical theatre performances and the spirit of celebration reverberated through post-season parties, recitals and receptions.

We broadened our reach to neighboring communities in Castroville, New Braunfels, and the Hill Country. Our efforts gave ready access to even more athletes who got to hit home runs, dance with passion and swim to the finish line—all while fostering the sense of celebration and pride that emanates from all Kinetic Kids programs.









Specifically serving kids with physical disabilities only, our SA Xtreme division grew 27% in 2023. These athletes dedicate their time and energy to compete at para-style competitions locally, regionally, nationally and even internationally!

GOAL ORIENTED

Two of our amazing SA Xtreme athletes were internationally classified while competing at a World Ranking Event for USA Archery this past summer. Like many other SA Xtreme athletes,

they have their eyes set on future Paralympic games. Their grit and determination are unmatched. Collectively, SAX athletes achieved 14 national records and EVERY athlete attained a personal record at various national competitions in their 2023 sport seasons.

AGILITYFIT

SA Xtreme AgilityFit is our newest off-season, adaptive training that helps our athletes increase their strength, endurance and mobility. Our athletes even see gains in their therapies outside of our

programming. Kinetic Kids
Executive Director and Physical
Therapist Kacey Wernli sees the
results in Mario. "AgilityFit is really
the only thing that has changed in
Mario's program. He works so hard
in class and has shown increased
trunk strength which has carried
over with improved walking and
other activities."

ARTIST & ATHLETE

Artemis started Musical Theatre in January and now she also competes on three SA Xtreme teams! Her newfound confidence is evident and it is amazing to see her progression in less than a year. She is also making huge strides on her high school track and field team. At first, her mom, Lindsey, would play interference on the track because Artemis would be so far behind her typical peers as they approached the finish line. Then Artemis hit her first huge milestone—being only 100m behind as the other runners crossed the finish line. Fast forward just a few weeks, and she was keeping up with the runners in her heat. Within a couple months, she beat two other girls! Lindsey knows her daughter is a warrior, "Artemis does it, but y'all gave her the tools, so thank you."





NEW DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE

In 2023, we continued to grow our SA
Premier Development League to fill a
gap that existed for athletes in basketball,
swimming, cheer and gymnastics who are
just learning to compete. This appropriate
pace and skill progression helps to develop
the athletes' understanding of gameplay, to
learn specific sport rules, and to prepare to
participate in higher level competitions.

COMPETITION RAMPS UP

Our kids love to compete, so we added two new competitions to our Kinetic Kids hosting schedule—Swimming and AgilityFit.

Alongside our Gymnastics, Basketball and Soccer tournaments, we hosted a total of five SA Premier competitions in 2023.

DANCE

Our SA Premier Dance Team had a standout year with their two dynamic routines. They won multiple first place awards throughout their competition season, and the "Life of the Party" award, which couldn't be more accurate for this team.

ROBOTICS

We are also excited about our Robotics Team taking their skills to the competition ring this year where they came out strong with a first place win! We are partnering with the Lutheran High School Robotics Team who help drive our success.



RESOURCE FAIR SELLS OUT AGAIN!

In June, an impressive gathering of 730 enthusiastic learners attended the Kinetic Kids EXPO powered by Community First Health Plans. This sold-out event showcased a diverse array of 70 equipment and resource vendors from across the United States and Canada. Families, caregivers, and clinicians immersed themselves in a myriad of offerings, including home safety modifications, adapted equipment, mobility devices, orthotics, prosthetics, special needs camps, legal services, therapy clinics, dental services and much more! And, of course, our EXPO attendees loved snapping selfies with our celebrity ambassador and grand marshal—The San Antonio Spurs Coyote! OUR MISSION: INCLUSION


Our mission extends beyond our adapted environment through Discovering Disabilities Day events, where we aim to elevate the quality of life for children with special needs by fostering awareness and inclusion in their community.

In collaboration with field experts, we've developed several interactive activities tailored for elementary students, creating a safe space for them to explore special needs and disabilities. Recognizing the importance of educating children during their formative years, our dynamic approach helps to build understanding. Participants experience simulated challenges such as wearing vision-limiting dark glasses, playing volleyball while sitting on the floor, and taking shots at regular and adapted basketball hoops—all while experiencing the complexities of maneuvering in a wheelchair! We emphasize the significance of using adapted equipment and explore a variety of sensory items their peers may need for focusing in the classroom. All of these experiences are intentional—to show, for a moment in time, what life might be like for some of their classmates with special needs.

In 2023, we held Discovering Disabilities Day events at five local schools, providing awareness training to 2,500 students who now have even more options for how to actively include their classmates with special needs.



KINETIC KID FOCUSES ON Crossing the Finish Line

Elizabeth was born with albinism, a genetic condition in which the person's body does not make melanin, which is responsible for production of pigment and the development of the eyes.

As a result, Elizabeth is legally blind and her vision can not be corrected with glasses or surgery. When she was little, Elizabeth's parents refused to let her visual impairment prevent their inquisitive child from being an active kid. She began swim lessons as a toddler for water safety.

In 2017, when Elizabeth was in first grade, a friend introduced the family to Kinetic Kids. Elizabeth began with a dance class at age seven. Since she was already swimming, she quickly jumped into the SA Xtreme competitive division to swim freestyle and breaststroke. Then, even though she had never done any type of track and field events, Elizabeth still decided to give it a try. Soon, she was practicing sprints, long jump, discus, javelin and shot put. In her first season, she debuted at the Endeavor Games in Edmond,

OK where she loved competing alongside new friends who shared her passsion for track and field.

By 2018, Elizabeth was ready for longer distances, and ran the 800m at the Lone Star Invitational. When the Endeavor Games rolled back around, she was ready for the 1500m. Elizabeth was only eight years old at the time, but the minimum age for the 1500m was U14. When Kinetic Kids requested permission for Elizabeth to run the 1500m, the request was approved as long as she entered ALL of her events in the the U14 age group. Not ony did she qualify for the 1500m at Junior Nationals, she also qualified in the 800m, 400m, 200m, 100m, long jump, discus, javelin and shot put, and in short course 50 backstroke, 50 breaststroke and 50 freestyle *and* long course 50m breaststroke, 100m backstroke and 100m breaststroke!!! Yes, that is 15 events! At the 2018 Junior Nationals, about six weeks after Elizabeth had run the 1500m for the first time at Endeavor Games. she took over a minute off of her

1500m time, finishing in 7:03 and breaking the national record for U14 as an 8-year-old! Since then, she has competed every year, continuing to break more records.

In 7th and 8th grades, she qualified to run the 1600m and 2400m for both track seasons at Garcia Middle School. And at the final meet of the season, she set a new school record in the 2400m.

Now a freshman at O'Connor High School, Elizabeth was the only freshman to make the Varsity Cross Country team and is looking forward to her first high school track season.

Our volunteers provide more than mere sports support. They also provide a sense of understanding and connection. Ember and Kayla are an inspiring participant-volunteer duo in our New Braunfels basketball program.

Ember's initial apprehension about joining Kinetic Kids basketball stemmed from a fear of standing out and being perceived as different due to her leg brace that she wears to address



impairments resulting from a traumatic brain injury. This smart and energetic young girl reluctantly joined the program, all the while being worried about how she would be accepted.

Enter Kayla Bogan, Ember's volunteer, who also was wearing a leg brace due to a recent knee surgery. Though their orthotic needs were different, their shared experience of utilizing support braces immediately bridged the gap for Ember on the court. Seeing Kayla confidently embrace her brace empowered Ember to do the same. In an extraordinary display of solidarity, when Kayla was given the all clear to remove her brace, she continued to wear it to practices.

Through their special bond, Ember's confidence flourished. She was soon wearing her brace proudly as she joined in on basketball drills with her newest friends.

The friendship between Ember and Kayla now extends beyond the basketball court. They still actively maintain communication, and Kayla consistently volunteers at various programs where Ember is involved. They are undeniable proof of the power of acceptance and inclusion.
