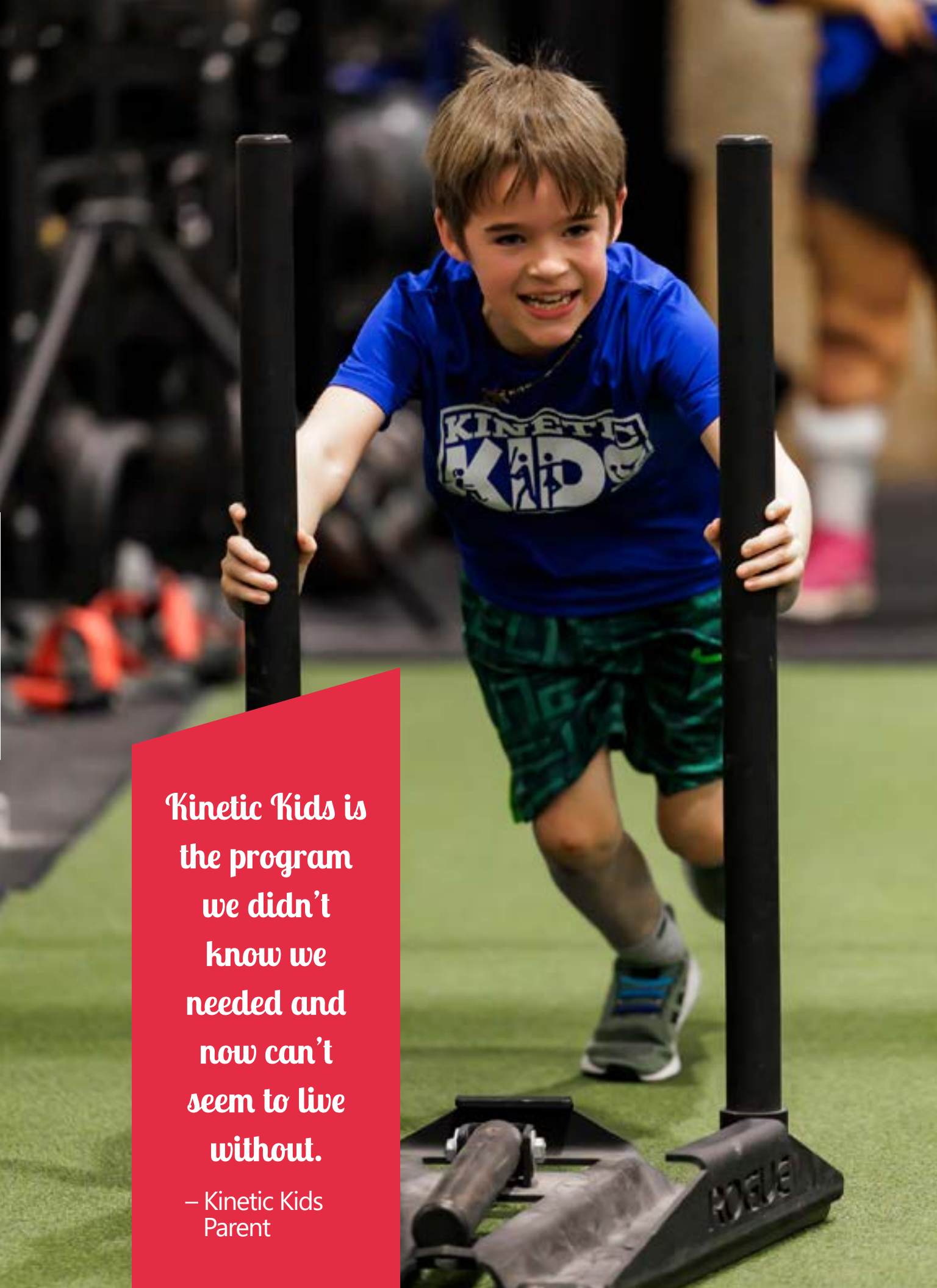

# Leading the Next Generation

Our veteran staff remember it as if it were yesterday. A young Toby barreling around the bases, his crutches pumping, flying down the line and sliding across home plate with a helping hand from his program director.

At just five years old, Toby Thomas joined Kinetic Kids' t-ball program. Even at a young age his determination and resilience were evident to those around him.

Toby's competitive spirit soon led him to our San Antonio Xtreme wheelchair basketball and track & field programs. It was there he discovered the power of sport in building perseverance and facing adversity. He credits our

track program as a turning point, helping him learn how to push through challenges, compete with confidence and achieve success.

Years later, Toby joined our AgilityFit program, where he learned foundational strength-training skills. That experience sparked an extraordinary journey, culminating in Toby becoming a three-time para powerlifting national champion, a four-time current national record holder and a member of Team USA Paralympic team.

Today, more than 15 years after that first t-ball team, Toby gives back to the program that opened his world. As an SA



Xtreme AgilityFit coach, he is now channeling his passion, expertise and determination into the next generation of Kinetic Kids athletes.

Charlie's family has been changed by EXPO and they return every year to see their friends at Canine Companions. They leave feeling hopeful about the support available to individuals with disabilities. Their advice to others considering EXPO is simple: GO! You might just meet your best friend. # EXPANDING UNDERSTANDING

## Discovering Disabilities Days

In 2025, Kinetic Kids hosted more Discovering Disabilities Days than ever, visiting nine elementary schools to promote awareness and inclusion. Students in San Antonio, Castroville and the Hill Country gained meaningful insight into life with a disability through hands-on activities such as playing basketball in a wheelchair, interacting with service animals and learning about prosthetic limbs. As a longtime supporter of our educational efforts, the San Antonio Amputee Foundation provides volunteers to bring the program to life for students. By sharing their life experiences—and even their limbs!—SAAF presenters create a welcoming environment where curiosity is encouraged. Children ask questions openly and even see and hold a prosthesis, expanding understanding at an early age.

# ON THE MOVE

After a brief hiatus, Bike Camp returned in 2025 with 37 children taking over the gym and parking lots at United Methodist Church. For many Kinetic Kids families, riding a bike seems attainable for their children. In partnership with iCanShine, The Believe It Foundation and Woom, Kinetic Kids Bike Camp makes the impossible, possible! Starting on roller bikes, participants quickly build balance, coordination and endurance. By the end of just five sessions, they are riding two-wheel bikes on their own! Watching riders race across the pavement is a powerful reminder of what kids can achieve with the right support!



# H-E-B, MAKING US BETTER

Kinetic Kids' ability to deliver gold-standard programming is powered not only by expert coaches, but by volunteers who show up with consistency and heart. In 2025, individual volunteers remained a vital part of our programs, but the most notable growth came from group volunteer support which nearly doubles over the year. Among our 58 volunteer groups, H-E-B stands out as a meaningful presence.

Throughout the year, H-E-B team members volunteered at kickball, drumming around and golf. From working one-on-one with participants to assisting coaches during drills and activities, their hands-on involvement helped create an environment where athletes could learn, grow and celebrate their successes.

For many H-E-B volunteers, witnessing children experience the joy of teamwork and achievement was a moving experience—one that turned first-time volunteers into returning supporters. Their willingness to engage with our athletes strengthened each program and reinforced what makes Kinetic Kids possible: a community that believes children of every ability deserve the opportunity to play, belong and thrive.

# Dreaming Bigger

For athletes with special needs the challenge is rarely talent, it's almost always access.

Too often, children with special needs are told their limits not their possibilities. Their opportunities and stages are small and 'appropriate.' Our San Antonio Premier Cheer team dreams bigger.

In the 2025 season, 14 athletes showed up week after week. Practices were built on growth. Not just learning the skills, but refining them. Practicing the routine over and over and then practicing some more, until it was just right. The standards were high. The team was so committed to success you would often hear athletes say "I can't, I have cheer practice." Their mindset was simple. "We practice, we work hard and we get better," said athlete Isabella.

Led by coaches Kathryn Crane and Karen Weber, who believe in the potential of each athlete, they knew the effort it would take to **reach it**. Along the way, athletes

gained more than technical skill. They gained confidence, independence and a community that shows up for them. "It's fun to be part of the team because I made a lot of friends and learned things I didn't know before," Isabella shared.

As their season progressed, the results followed. The team found success at local and regional competitions, then claimed a national title. Each win was exhilarating in its own right, but they were building toward something even bigger.

After months of discipline and determination, they got the call—

the team had earned a bid to the World Cheer Competition at Disney World in Orlando, Florida. They had successfully outcheered 27 other teams to secure one of the four coveted spots!

One team member Kallie reflected, "I got to cheer with my best friends and rock the stage at Worlds." They didn't just rock the stage, they owned it, claiming first place and Kinetic Kids' first-ever world title.

"I have truly never been more proud of our athletes," shared Coach Kathryn, who knows exactly what it took to reach the highest level of competition. Their world title is a result of their hard work, but it is also evidence that when opportunity is made accessible, when expectations are high and when support is strong, athletes with special needs rise to meet the moment.

For athlete Omega, the success captured something deeper than a title. "It is a really good thing that we are able to go to Disney World and compete like typical kids because we get told, 'you can't do this, you can't do that.' Well, clearly we can."



# SPACE MAKES IT POSSIBLE

At Kinetic Kids, creating access for kids of all abilities is at the heart of everything we do. Our partner Lacuna Autism Services shares this mission. They believe access should never be a barrier and they understand the importance of being in the community. Lacuna has opened the doors to every one of their five locations at no cost to Kinetic Kids. Because of this partnership, we are able to expand our programming and give more children with special needs consistent, accessible opportunities to learn, grow and shine.
